



# HCHS/SOL Annual Follow-Up Interview Childhood Factors Questionnaire – CFE(S) – QxQ 4/17/2025

## General Information

The Childhood Factors Questionnaire (CFE/S in CDART) contains questions about childhood financial resources and vulnerability. It should be administered either at the end of the Annual Follow-up interview, or in-person during an ancillary study visit. Unlike the regular AFU interview, the CFE/S may be administered outside the AFU window. All HCHS participants that are eligible for AFU and able to complete the questionnaire should be invited to complete the Childhood Factors Questionnaire.

The questionnaire should only be completed with the participant, not with a proxy or alternate respondent. The questionnaire should be administered in the preferred language of the participant.

For all questions, if the participant refuses to answer or indicates that they do not know the answer, enter the corresponding field status.

## Question by Question Instructions

**Q0a.** Enter the date the questionnaire is completed.

**Q0b.** Enter staff ID.

**Q1.** The definitions for rural area, small town, large town, and large city are based on the participant's interpretation.

**Q2-Q6.** After asking each question, read out the answer choices to the participant. Record the participant's response in the dropdown menu.

The term "childhood" is meant to be general, and does not refer to a specific age range.

**Q7a-Q7hi.** Read each option aloud to the participant and record the participant's response (No/Yes).

**Q7h1.** This field will be enabled in CDART if Q7h is "Yes".

**Q7i1.** This field will be enabled in CDART if Q7i is "Yes".

**Q8-10.** Select the participant's answer from the dropdown menu. For these questions, the phrase "when (or while) you were growing up" is meant to be general, and does not refer to a specific age range.

**Q11.** Read out each answer choice and select the participant's answer from the dropdown menu. The phrase "while you were growing up" is meant to be general, and does not refer to a specific age range.
